This week I encourage you to read Isaiah 40: 1-11 together. In this section, we are with Isaiah again. Isaiah 40 starts the proclamation of the coming of Jesus Christ. I encourage you to focus as a family on verse 1 and spend some time discussing how we can comfort "our people" during this advent season. As you read verses 3-5, think of it as a construction site, which might help the kids understand it better.



I think verse 11 provides us with that comforting image of God as our shepherd. This is an image that I think we can connect to. That image of God picking us up and carrying us in his arms.

We are anxiously awaiting the arrival of your son. We ask that during this time you help us to provide comfort to those in need. Thank you for being our great shepherd and picking us up and carrying us when we need to be carried. In your name we pray, Amen.


