Summer Time and the Living is . . . Crazy!

We've come into summer as a congregation out of . . .

- 3 months of remote, quarantined, virtual life.
- 4 months of concerns about how to live healthy lives and help others do the same,
- 4 weeks of societal unrest related to racism.
- 3 months of virtual worship, bibles studies, prayer groups, meetings,
- 3 months of discovering how to care for one another at a distance,
- 5 months of early-stage life as interim pastor (intentional transitional leader) and congregation, and
- 5 weeks of first-layer conversations about what we value about Knox and the dreams we have for our life and ministry.

We will again be collecting towels, bedding, blankets and gently used clothing for the homeless shelter and our Sisseton community. Used or new would be fantastic.




You can sign your name on them or leave them anonymous.


