


Sermon on the Mount, Matthew 5-7

been, and still is, being shaped by pandemic, economic and societal realities. As we look back on what was real prior to the coronavirus and look at what seems real now, what comes to mind? Are things very different for you or not so very different? Did your things shift like a 7.2 magnitude earthquake or more like a 1.7 tremor? With any shifting and every level of challenge, were you aware that it offered a time to take stock of life in a fresh way?

When Jesus stepped on the scene in Roman-occupied Judea in the 1st Century, he came to point out how warped the world was for his fellow Jews and for all people. His words and actions revealed that their assumptions about life and godliness might have been largely, if not totally, mistaken. That can be true for us, too, whether we recognize it or not.

On a mission of compassionate correction, Jesus began to teach with the hope that they were ready to listen. His teaching wasn't just about information. It was meant to inspire and transform each person. It was meant to bring about God's deepest best for the people of God then and now.

Jesus' words are a hard-hitting manifesto and imploring invitation at the same time. They call us up short and also encourage us to live increasingly in the ways of Jesus. This isn't just a message to individual followers of Jesus. It is a message to the Church of Messiah Jesus world-wide and to us as Knox Presbyterian. This is not an easy message. It challenges every single assumption we've had about what makes a great congregation and about the mission of God in the world.

There's no better time for us as Knox to consider who we are as a congregation and what God is asking of us all. Let's consider, then, what we have right, what we have wrong and how we can be more fully who God calls us to be. Join in as we step up close to Jesus for "Church Re-Discovered."




Agape Love
