A Note From Pastor Pat

In my mind, August is associated immediately with just one thing. Before I get to that, however, let's do a little context. We might remember August is short for Augustus, the first Roman emperor. The Roman Senate honored the emperor by putting his name in place of the month Sextilis. Of course, everyone knows that. Not likely! The root meaning of the word augustus is venerable or auspicious.

- Our worship on Sunday, September 6th will honor Knox's 60th anniversary! It will include special reflections on all that God did in our beginning and what God has done over these six amazing decades. Whether worship remains virtual only or not, you won't want to miss it.
- Children's Day Out is gearing up for a September 8 start in service to families throughout our larger community with full health practices in place. Pray for Beth and all staff as they prepare for their full investment in the lives of these children.
- A congregation-wide fall worship and discussion group emphasis begins
 September 13th. We are very close to the time we can share more details. Please stay tuned!






