In Luke 2: 22-40, we will read about two prophets, who are people that are guided by God's Spirit and are able to look into the future. The first was a man named Simeon. When he saw Jesus, he praised God because he knew that he was seeing the Messiah, the one who came to bring God's love to the world.

The second prophet was a woman named Anna, who praised God because she recognized the child, Jesus, as the one who had been sent by God. The story then tells us, "the child was growing, and was becoming strong in spirit, being filled with wisdom, and the grace of God was upon him" (Luke 2:40)

This is our prayer for you. That you grow strong and be filled with wisdom to make good choices. You may not know what you want to be when you grow up, but know that God's love, God's favor, is upon each one of you. And like it says in Jeremiah 29:11, "'For I know the plans I have for you,' declares the Lord, 'plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future.'"
