#### Deborah Kapp



In 1971, when Deborah Kapp told her mother that she would be attending seminary in New York City, her mother was worried. "It's dangerous," she said. "There will be a blackout! Here—take the flashlight." It turns out that Deborah's mother was right. Even in the protective walls of Union Theological Seminary, New York was a little dangerous, and, yes, there was a blackout (that was several years later, and unfortunately by then Deborah couldn't remember where she had put the flashlight). It also turns out that her mother was wrong. As edgy, dirty, noisy, and confusing as it could be, living in New York was also stimulating, enriching, joyful, and at times absolutely glorious.

In New York, Deborah fell in love with the city, and much of her ministry has occurred in urban settings. As a Minister of Word and Sacrament in the Presbyterian

Church (U.S.A.) she has served churches in Montclair, NJ (Central Presbyterian Church, Interim Assistant Pastor for Christian Education, 1975-77), Chicago, IL (Fourth Presbyterian Church, Assistant/Associate Pastor, 1981-91), and Hartford, CT (First Presbyterian Church, Pastor, 1991-95). She also co-staffed the Pittsburgh office for United Presbyterian Women as a member of the national denominational staff (1977-80). In 1995 Deborah joined the faculty of McCormick Theological Seminary. Since 2006 she has served McCormick as the Edward F. and Phyllis K. Campbell Associate Professor of Urban Ministry.

In addition to receiving her M.Div. from Union Theological Seminary in New York City, Deborah holds an undergraduate degree from Brown University and M.A. and Ph.D. degrees in sociology from Loyola University Chicago. At Loyola, Deborah's work focused on the sociology of religion and culture; her primary research examined the practice and performance of worship in several congregations. It was in the context of this work that she got hooked on the avocation of hymnody.

On a more personal note, Deborah was born and raised in central and western Pennsylvania, and harbors an irrational devotion to Nittany Lion football, the Pittsburgh Pirates, and the Pittsburgh Steelers. In later life she also learned to savor the adventures of the Chicago White Sox and the UConn women's basketball team. She is married to Anthony (Tony) Ruger, whom she met while they were both students at Union. They live in Oak Park. Tony and Deborah have two sons, Geoffrey (27) and Peter (25). Their family also has two cats, Yoshi and My Darlin' Nellie Gray (Nell).



Anyone planning to serve in Knox's Youth or Children's Ministries must comply with the requirements of the Knox Safe Haven Policy (adopted August 2012). These requirements are:

- 1. Read the SHP Policy and sign the Policy's Covenant Statement
- 2. Complete a Volunteer Application which is the last page of the SHP
- 3. Attend a SHP Training Session

Volunteers are required to attend a SHP Training Session every 3 years. If you attended a Training Session less than 3 years ago, you need only comply with steps 1 and 2 above.

Completed paperwork is to be dropped in the secure silver drop box which is located on the landing outside of the receptionist's office. This landing is at the top of the half flight of steps just inside of the front doors.
