"The 21st Century Challenge: America's Changing Role in a Multi-polar World"

Speaker: Morgan Plummer, U.S. Army

In the fifteen years since 9-11, the world and America's place within it has undergone significant change. The clash of cultures--and religions--has played a key part in these changes, and the road to peace is fraught with both dangers and opportunities. University Press, 2014) and recently wrote an article for The Christian Century entitled "Seeing Whiteness: Exercises in Understanding Race" (July 7, 2016).

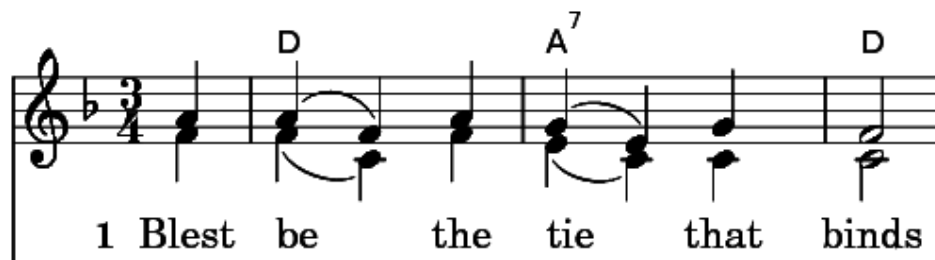
