

A LETTER FROM REV CLINTON

On Christian Friendship

"But I have called you friends, because I have made known to you everything I have heard from my Father." -John 15:15

In this high-pressure, activity-driven society in which we live, there seems to be less and less time for genuine friendship. People can be so driven by the demands of work and family, the time required to develop lasting friendships gets sidelined or even abandoned altogether. And yet, as time passes, and we watch our children grow into adults with friends of their own, having our own friends becomes ever more precious and important.

Like God, true friends know all about us and still love us. Like God, true friends are willing to forgive us when we cause them hurt or injury. True friends don't want something from us--they want to share something with us, life in all its joys and sorrows. Perhaps that is what God wants, too, which is why Jesus ties his own offer of friendship to the words and will of his Father. Genuine friendship is one of the greatest treasures in life. Beyond the love of our families, friends can create an extended family or "framily" which sometimes holds a more intimate place in our constellation of relations than many of our blood-relatives do. If family is a given, friendships are chosen--yet they require the same kind of cultivation and care.

What makes Christian friendship distinctive is our acknowledgment and welcome of Jesus into the very fabric of our relationships to others. Over time, these friendships take on a spiritual dimension of self-giving, self-emptying love. The strength and power of these friendships defy the erosion of time and distance. Not even death can truly bring these friendships to an end. When Jesus offered his disciples his friendship on the eve of his own death, he was opening a door to each of them and to all of us to experience the grace of life together. A life of Christian friendship ties us to Christ and to each other in ways which bring joy, love, hope and peace beyond measure.

I pray that each of you might have one or more persons in your life whom you can truly call "friend." You will possess no greater treasure than this.

I also pray that each of you might come to know Jesus as the one who calls you "friend" –along with the uttermost gift of his faithfulness, forgiveness and love.

Knox Donates Diapers to Teen Parent Connection

Last month Knox congregation donated 13 boxes of diapers to Teen Parent Connection (TPC). 25 Years Scott Moreau Pastors Education Fund

The Scott Moreau Pastors Education Fund has something to celebrate: This year it will be 25 years since Douglas Muchiri and Kingsley Nyirenda received the first Scott Moreau Fund scholarships. Both men were students preparing to go into Christian Ministry in Africa. Thanks to the contributions of the Knox congregation and others, the Scott Moreau Fund Steering Committee has been able to award scholarships to 55 students at

the International Leadership University in Nairobi, Kenya (formerly known as the Nairobi International School of Theology). The total amount of scholarships awarded has reached \$175,000. Most students are supported between 1-3 years in order to complete their studies. The creation of the Scott Moreau Fund was initiated after members of Knox leadership asked Scott what they might do to carry on the work that Knox had supported Scott to do in Africa. Scott urged that student needed to be educated in their own culture resulting in these pastoral candidates remaining in their own communities. Since its beginning in 1992, 15 people have had the pleasure of serving on the Scott Moreau Fund. Thank you congregation of Knox for your ongoing support. The Scott Moreau Fund Steering Committee
