

A LETTER FROM REV CLINTON

"You Give and Take Away"

Early in Lent, I stood among a group of family and friends in a darkened room, in Cardiac ICU, where a deeply-cherished woman - someone's sister, daughter, mother and wife - was gently breathing her last. The stillness of that darkened room filled to overflowing with clasped hands and tear-streaked faces was something holy in itself. And when she (almost imperceptibly) released her final breath, every beating heart in that room knew that she was exhaling: literally leaving the house of her body to cross an unseen, shining threshold that led from death to life. What remained in that darkened room after her departure was love: love and the certainty that she had been raised.

Pastor Samuel Son writes in <u>The Presbyterian Outlook</u>, "The mythologization of Easter," or "turning Easter into not much more than a Christianized spring festival with bunnies" is "no longer a commitment of everything to the death-shattering event of the empty tomb. A shriveled grape doesn't make good wine, and a mythological resurrection can't sustain a church against the powers of the world." I think Rev. Son is right. When we diminish the core assertion of our Christian faith ("He is risen!") into little more than a metaphor, then sooner or later we will stand empty and bereft before the reality of death. Like a breath that is taken, death will have the last word.

What I witnessed in that darkened hospital room was precisely the opposite. Death did not have the last word. Love did. And far from being the end, it seemed to me more like a beginning: like something lovely and fragile and glimmering was being gently cradled by pierced hands, coaxed into flying for the very first time.

"When You take away their breath, they die," wrote the Psalmist. But the text doesn't end with this. "When You send forth Your Spirit, they are created, and You renew the face of the earth" (Ps. 104:29). Death is real. It cannot be mythologized. Without it, there can be no resurrection. But the Breath of God, which is Life itself, cannot be constrained by death. God was, and is, and will be; death has no dominion where love remains, because God is love.



May the reality of resurrection - Christ's and our own - fill you with joy and peace this Easter. For we believe that in Christ, death itself has died, and love abides where loving hearts receive him still. "The Lord is Risen!" And so shall we. Because "love never ends."

Last August, when America's attention was focused on the conventions, a cyclone dropped more than 6.9 trillion gallons of water on Louisiana, flooding ten rivers and filling over 150,000 homes with muddy waters--some over ten feet deep.
