Dear Friends,

I learned many great things while our son and his family were living with us-not the least of which were tutorials in social media! It was very funny watching Evan and Grayce Mae make faces and exclamations for Snapchat. Who knew? "Not I", says the happy baby boomer. We all roared and an amusing use of one form of social media was in play. Evan would also sigh on a weekly basis when asked for yet another tutorial in how to turn on Netflix.



Daily, our lives are "infiltrated" with Tweets,

Instagrams, Texts, Facebook Likes, YouTubers, Pins for our Boards, and Yelp Reviews. We receive news in so many multi-faceted ways we are nearly immune to its impact or whether it is good, bad or ugly. Our news gets lumped together from all possible sources and we become numb.

Since Easter, I have been somewhat haunted by the first verse of our Lenten study in the gospel of Mark - 1:1. "The beginning of the good news of Jesus Christ, the Son of God". God began a new thing in Jesus that is meant to change the world's understanding of news.

Mark, along with the other gospel writers, was compelled to share news that stood in contrast to all other news. This news was the good news, intended for all the world and all the generations of readers and listeners to come. All news (of the world) would now be viewed through the lens of God's good news in Jesus. It was meant to be experienced and shared.

"Social Media" in Jesus day was mostly word of mouth. 14 centuries later the printing press set off a media revolution with the Gutenberg Bible and the Good News of the gospel had exponential impact. Today, we think of it all as that which is technological.

Yet, here's a reality for us to consider - we are and always have been Jesus' "social media". We are the most effective form of communication. Together, in thought, word and deed we have the greatest potential for setting off a revolution of good news in a bad news world.

It is a good thing to like and share the gospel of Jesus Christ!


## Knox Implements Giving and Payments Through Texting

According to Pew Research, 81 percent of American adults use cell phones to send or receive text messages. And it's not just for chatting with friends. One in ten has already made a charitable contribution or payment via text message. In fact, a recent study found that most people named texting as their preferred method of giving to churches and charitable organizations.

Knox has taken advantage of the shift toward mobile technology and texting, not just for mass communication, but also to provide another giving option for your convenience.

## How to Give Via Text:


### 1. Text any amount



Send a text to 73256 (you can store this in your contacts if you wish).

In the body of your message, type the word "KNOX" and the dollar amount of your gift or payment separated by a space. For example, text "KNOX 25" to give \$25.

### 2. Complete your gift



The system will then respond with a link to the secure webpage to complete your gift or payment.

Enter your credit card or debit card information. You also have the option to pay directly from the bank account of your choice.

You will receive a confirmation once completed.

## Why is Knox doing this?

1. **It's fast, easy, and convenient.** No cash, no checkbook, no problem! Knox's text giving doesn't require you to download an app, it's simple to use.
2. **It's safe and secure.** Your transaction is handled through a secure webpage, linked to our financial system and your credit card processor.
3. Your gifts and payments are recorded in our financial system. All your gifts and payments will show up on your quarterly statements. Just make sure that the email you use on the secure webpage is the one we have on record.

## Summer Blood Drive

On June 12, 3:30-7:30 pm, Knox will sponsor its annual Summer Blood Drive. This drive is in cooperation with the Heartland Blood Centers. Our current blood drive goal is only 20 units of blood. It used to be 45 to 50 units of blood.

With the end of the school year and the beginning of summer activities there is, unfortunately, an increase in demand for blood products. The blood products derived from a drive such as Knox's has a limited shelf-life. These products normally can last around 42 days.

Thus, Heartland is continually trying to meet current demands. That is the reason why Knox and countless other churches and organizations are asked to participate in regular blood drives. Heartland generally attempts to collect nearly 400 units of blood every day to meet the needs of the Chicagoland hospitals it serves. The blood products collected at our drives are used for the everyday patient. That is, grandparents, parents and children, who need the blood products derived from these drives for surgery and treatment.

If you cannot give blood, there are other ways of getting involved in the drive. First, you can recommend the Knox blood drive to eligible family members and friends. Also, there is a need for volunteers to help make this drive possible. So, whether you can give blood or not, you can participate by helping to sign donors up before the drive or work on the day of the drive.
