A Letter from Pastor Pat Smith



When I first stood among you several weeks ago on the first weekend of February, I shared that I believe we have been brought together as congregation and interim pastor under God's wondrous loving plan. This alignment, this remarkable confluence of place, people and a moment in time, is provided as a gift from God so we can discover and step into all that God wants to show us.

We all are part of this story, this particular part of the larger story of Knox. It occurs to me that this year marks sixty years of God's work within and through this


congregation. God has tended this church, this spiritual vineyard, through repositioning, pruning, and providing deep connections with Jesus, with one another and with the world in which we live. God's goal is that we consistently bear lots of really great spiritual fruit in season and out.

"What does it mean for Pat to do the work of interim pastor in this long term role?" you might wonder. I could answer by some points from some interim manual, but I'd prefer to answer from the heart. I am, in no particular order,

- (1)an apprentice who seeks to live surrendered to the Lord God, Rabbi Jesus, every day;
- (2) an observer of people, details, sweeping movements of culture and society and what the Spirit of God might be stirring up at any given moment;
- (3) a spiritual companion and encourager who comes alongside people in the journey of faith;
- (4) a contemplative who seeks to be open to what God wants to change in me;
- (5) an adventurer who believes that something new and of consequence is around every corner;
- (6) a wagon master who has some knowledge of what lies ahead and does my best to guide people to that new place;
- (7) an embedded consultant with some experience and information that may help people become more and more like Jesus;
- (8) a shepherd who seeks to lead, love and care like the Good Shepherd Jesus;
- (9)a cultivator of context and people so the greatest amount of good spiritual fruit can come to full ripeness.

With these traits combined as they are in me, I rejoice in the privilege of stepping among you as we live into our quest to know and follow our Rabbi, Master and King, Jesus of Nazareth, God in the flesh. Even with all these words about me, I know this intentional transitional time is not really about me. It's about all of us as we step into life with one another for the journey ahead. I cherish the opportunity to see it all unfold with you.

Most of us really don't like to spend any more time than necessary in the dark. That can be especially true for us in childhood. In those years we are likely to be sure there are lots of scary things out there in the dark whether outside the walls of our houses, beyond the reach of a street light or outside the circle of light thrown by a campfire. We probably all know, as children and adults, that there are things that lurk in the most unseemly of ways, real and imagined.

Because of this, we tend to run to the light as quickly as possible. We equate light with safety and hope and promise and what delights. In the light we can see clearly. We know what's there and are comforted by this knowledge of all that is in clear view. Light draws us because in it we expect things to make sense. Just think how good it feels to have plenty of light around the places we live and shop.

Lent is a season where we know the light of Jesus' resurrection is on its way and allow ourselves to be drawn to it one step at a time. In a way, we are invited to live toward the light without rushing toward it. There is value in moving slowly and reflectively, feeling the weight of our current realities, as we allow them to stir us and allow God to stir us right in the midst of the hard, the challenging and the uncertain.

We'll walk through a series of texts that allow us to fully invest ourselves in this Lenten season, this approach through the darkness. We will definitely get to the wondrous light to come, but the journey to it is something we can embrace, something we can welcome, when we live with the expectation that God walks with us every step of the way. What will God show us as "Darkness Gives Way to Light?" Let's all step into this Lenten journey and find out!



Meet the Knox Mission Council's new 2020 Mission Recipients

In 2008, Jake and Gina Anderson came to Brazil as members of Wycliffe Bible Translators. In the vast expanses of the largest rainforest on earth, Bible translation projects, church

planting, leadership training, and evangelism are under way even at great distances from the closest towns or cities. In a massive area with almost no roads, the airplane is an essential tool to assure that these projects proceed with speed and safety. With Jake as pilot and head mechanic, he flies missionaries and Doctors Without Borders into the most inaccessible villages in the Amazon. Jake and Gina are affiliated with the Presbyterian Church of Brazil and are home schooling their 4 children (the youngest are brother and sister orphans they adopted). In addition to their missionary work, they are responsible for raising all their own living and plane expenses. The Knox Mission Council is pleased to be able to help Jake and Gina in this worthy cause.



FREE Fire Department Service for Naperville Seniors

To keep Naperville seniors safe, the Naperville Fire Department now offers a free "Senior Home Fire Safety Survey" to help seniors (65+) identify features in their home that might make their residence susceptible to fire or injuries due to falls. (But see fire-preventive

resource at end helpful to one of any age or location.)

Even though I thought I had no problems, I requested an inspection as soon as I heard about this service. And thank God I did, because it revealed mistakes I'd made that could have cost me my life or the loss of my home to fire. To request an inspection, mention the Knox newsletter when you email Soraya McLaughlin, Public Education Specialist, at McLaughlins@naperville.il.us. You will receive in-home safety information as well as fire and fall prevention tips. Your home visit includes a written home safety survey with smoke detectors (if needed), a carbon monoxide detector, kitchen fire extinguisher, and other goodies.

Believing that others have made the same mistakes I made, I published a Special Report about this experience for my website subscribers that <u>you can read online</u>. It includes the Fire Department's checklist, which will enable anyone to do their own home fire safety check. It also details all that I learned during my FD inspection, web links to related topics and products, and special steps I've taken to give myself an extra layer of 9-1-1 security.




TPC Is So Thankful!
