# A NOTE FROM PASTOR PAT



There are plenty of shifting aspects to our Knox life of ministry and mission right now as we head into November, some wonderful and some that might leave us wishing the story line could be different. Let me share three of these elements as of press time.

#### In-Person Worship:

The weekend of October 17 and 18, 90 people joyously and gratefully gathered for the first time since mid-March for in-person worship in a similar vein to our "usual" worship gatherings of years past. We learned within two days of that second service that our region of Illinois was under mitigation due to rising trends of pandemic numbers. We checked with the DuPage County Health Department and they informed us that churches could have 25 and fewer people gather together in our premises or on our grounds for the time being. That led us to cancel in-person worship for two weekends. This was intended to give leadership time to take into account all aspects of how we best live into this stage of mitigation. Session met this past Monday and, after extensive conversation unanimously passed this motion: For the purpose of protecting the Knox community and community at-large, due to the safety and health concerns from the adverse metrics and increasing hospitalizations with COVID-19, the Knox Session determines that we will cancel all live in-person church services until review at the November 9, 2020 Session Meeting, or earlier Special Called Session meeting.

We know all of us want to see in-person worship start as soon as allowed and advisable for those ready to attend. We look forward to the time we will worship in our Sanctuary again.

#### Canoeing the Mountains:

Our Session, Deacons and Program Staff embarks this month on an exploration of the dynamic nature of ministry in our current cultural context. As we openly consider the changing nature of our world, we will be better able to grasp what God wants to show Knox about who we need to be and what we need to do in the years ahead. The catalyst for this three month long invested conversation is the book Canoeing the Mountains: Christian Leadership in Uncharted Territory by Presbyterian pastor Tod Bolsinger.

This book introduces us to the possibility that what lies ahead for us as Knox will provide the opportunity to step into new, vibrant and strategic shifts in order to follow where Christ leads. The author will join our officers and staff virtually in three conversations in November, December and January to offer current, cutting edge insights. Please pray for our leaders over these months.
